YOU AS A STUDENT

- Keep to the three principles of our behaviour policy
 - Ready to Learn
 - Respect Everyone
 - Rise to the challenge
- Are punctual and attend regularly
- Keep to the school dress code
- Work to the best of your ability, complete homework on time and meet deadlines
- Take responsibility for your own learning, organisation and behaviour
- Participate in Tutor and House activities
- Avoid bullying behaviour and report it to staff if you are aware of it happening to others
- Attend free-time or after school detentions if they are issued

YOU AS A PARENT/CARER

- Support the school's ethos and policy as set out in school documentation
- Ensure that contact and other essential information is kept up to date
- Use appropriate channels to voice concerns about your child
- Inform the school if your child is not able to attend due to medical or other acceptable reasons
- Ensure regular and punctual attendance by your child
- Avoid taking your child out of school other than for exceptional reasons
- Ensure your child comes to school with the appropriate uniform and equipment
- Provide an appropriate environment and time at home to enable your child to complete homework
- Endeavour to support the school's activities (parent evenings/concerts/events) and encourage your child to do so
- Advise the school of problems/achievements/issues concerning your child
- Respond to school communications as requested
- Deal with concerns about your child in a respectful and courteous manner

AS A SCHOOL

- Provide a safe and caring environment for learning
- Provide effective teaching
- Provide appropriate social, moral, cultural and spiritual guidance
- Effectively monitor your child's progress
- Praise your child for their achievements
- Set appropriate homework and advise you of expectations in accordance with the school homework policy
- Advise you about the equipment, books and materials that are required for school
- Provide up to date and timely information about school's events
- Provide enrichment activities
- Communicate our concerns and problems concerning your child in a timely manner
- Deal with problems in a professional, fair and consistent manner
